Uniquely made

1Sam3:1-10, Psalm 139, Jn.1:43-51

'Can anything good come out of Nazareth?' says Nathaniel. I used to say the same thing about the former mining town of Normanton in West Yorkshire as I travelled through its grim and dilapidated Victorian station platforms on the pay train to Leeds as an undergraduate student. God has a sense of humour: the town became my home for over 30 years, the parish church where Sarah and I worshipped was at the centre of a national movement of the Holy Spirit in worship and over 15 people were called and sent into full time ministry during our time there. What on the face of it appeared forgotten, worn out and insignificant was used (and continues to be used) in a very deep and significant way. We can often think of ourselves in a similar way. What use am I? What do I have to offer? Others are far more capable than I am. I remember hearing the wonderful Bible teacher Joyce Meyer saying *'Compare if you dare'* it's an activity that wastes precious energy and frequently leads us into either arrogance or self-pity.

The amazing truth is that we have no need of comparison as we are utterly and completely unique. There never *has been* anyone in all creation like you and there never *will be*. How astonishing is that? Scripture teaches us that God created us and gave us a unique identity. He alone sees us as we truly are and knows what potential there is within us. Jesus knew who Nathaniel *really* was before he met him. God made us and King David rejoices in this wonderful truth in the words of psalm 139; *'Lord you have searched me out and know me' ... 'I am marvellously (fearfully and wonderfully) made.'* We all have something perfectly unique to offer to the world. It doesn't matter how old or how young we are or what our background is, God calls us to be totally, authentically and divinely who He made us to be. In these challenging days of living with the virus, I believe that we are redefining and rediscovering what is truly important to us as humanity is drawn to looking afresh at the value and meaning of life; but I also believe that we shall never truly know what that is until we get to know Him.

Last week I spoke of the blessing there is in spending time with God and getting to know and to hear His voice. As with any other relationship, this can take time and often needs the help of others along the way. Samuel didn't immediately recognise God's voice and needed Eli to help him in responding to it and to grow in that relationship. I wonder what God might be saying to you at the moment. Is there something specific on your heart? Are you listening for prompts or do you think that this would never happen to you? The psalm reminds us that God's presence is all around us and that he lays his hand upon us. We can all benefit from taking time to listen for and to the voice of Christ within us. God invites every one of us into a relationship with Him for He has a wonderful plan for you and just for you and as long as we're still here, then we still have something to contribute. It's an exciting realisation isn't it?

I encourage all of us to take time this week to listen for the voice of God who knows *you* perfectly, calling your name and inviting you to know *Him* more.
