"Squares Shares."

It's good to think about how we identity ourselves, how will we be known and what we are known by. Actually, that's something personally that I've struggled with, as anybody would, after they've retired from a busy very intense career as a teacher in senior leadership. I was that person in my own right, having my own life with a distinct identity and purpose, and suddenly I've been left with the fact that I don't really have a role as such unless its "Vicars wife" which is what lots of people call me. I am a Vicar's wife but that is not my identity. I happen to be married to a vicar (great one at that and very proud too).

Actually, it's been an interesting journey because when I truly came to Faith and gave my heart to 100% following Jesus Christ I know that my I had changed in my allegiance to who was number 1 in my life. I followed and wanted to be known as a follower of Jesus Christ and not just a 'church goer' or Anglican or even teacher.

We still go on through life, don't we... take on work and develop our personalities with hobbies, important roles in society and within our families. These are all wonderful things of God. Soaked into our identity is the amazing rich culture that we are part of. The character that we and society and God allows and creates in us is good, But God asks us to root our identity in Christ. "Christ in me the hope of Glory." Because one day, all that other stuff will get taken away. And one day there will be none of it except for Him and me and that will be all that is left at the end of it. If our identity is strong in Him then our security is strong in him too. How amazing is that and that's what I have learnt. It doesn't really matter about having a role.

The truth of the matter is that he wants us to follow Him as King in our life. The Old Testament says that He is King and he warns against us idolising other 'kings' which could be... possessions, work even people or creation itself. Who do we worship? Who is our King? What or who is most important to me? This can be very challenging, but when our King is Almighty God the Creator when we worship Him essentially above all others and root our identity in Jesus as Lord, then we are gifted with unending strength and nourishment and eternal security.

We always have a choice. That's the wonderful thing about God. He forces nothing on us and gives us free will to choose, but does also ask of us to follow His truth. Never without an incredible portion of Grace. God's Grace is actually more powerful. It understands where we are and accepts us with a great heart of LOVE ...but always gives us room to change.

So ... some questions to reflect upon. Who am I? Where is my allegiance? Who do I follow? Who is my King?
