

The character of Jesus

As an undergraduate drama student I spent a considerable amount of time studying and putting into practice the teaching of the 19/20th century Russian theatre practitioner Konstantin Stanislavski.

He was noted as an outstanding character actor of his day and was responsible for the approach known as 'method acting' – the ability to think yourself into the personality and behaviour of someone else by examining their motives and emotions to create a realistic performance.

The mother of Peter Sellers told of an invitation to meet her son on the set of his latest film and to have lunch with him. Once 'in role' Sellers had a formidable reputation for not allowing anything or anyone to break in and disturb his focus. On her return home the taxi driver asked her if she had had an enjoyable day with her son; she famously replied '*No: I never got to meet him*'.

The writer of the letter to the Hebrews (extracts of which feature in our readings over the next two weeks) was trying to explain to new converts the true character and identity of Jesus. They were becoming confused as to who he is and to understanding that they (and us) *can* meet him and get to know him for who he *really* is.

The writer explains that he is greater than any other being, any other teacher or religious system. He is the '**heir of all things**', he was involved in creation and is the ultimate revelation of God. There is something wonderfully extraordinary about Jesus that no one, not even the angels can be compared to him. He came to be involved in our lives and make it possible for us to have a restored relationship with God. He is our '**great high priest**'. If we want to know what God is like we are called to look to Jesus. Jesus himself said '*Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father*' ^{John 14:9}. Everything we read and understand about God in the Bible must be read through the lens of Jesus, who he is and why he came. Jesus is unique and Jesus is all we need. He forgives our past, he blesses our present and he secures our future. Wonderful !

Whatever we are facing now, whatever we might have faced and experienced in the past, Jesus is the key to getting our lives in order. The key to understanding the Bible is Jesus. The key to understanding the character of God is Jesus. The key to LIFE is Jesus.

Might we live and enjoy our lives in the continued joy of this truth and if you have not yet experienced this for yourselves, don't waste time I commend him to you.


