From the Vicarage:

Christians in Ordinary Time

What a month of celebration we had in May, with its usual bank holidays and special days for the coronation. The sun shone and gardens produced a bumper crop of blossom right up to Pentecost. That festival of the Holy Spirit rounds off the Easter Season with its stories of how Jesus came to be recognised as our King.

Now in June we are back into what the Church calls Ordinary Time though we have one more Sunday with a special label, Trinity. Preachers find it difficult to prepare sermons for Trinity Sunday because it is the day we put the whole Christian story together. We remember that when we talk about God we mean a being who is author of every part of creation including distant galaxies and yet is close enough to breathe words into our heart. Our God is utterly different from us and yet one part of God has been born and lived on earth and is one of us: our brother, our friend and our King. It is too much for one sermon, far too much for us ever to grasp all the implications.

So in the weeks after Trinity Sunday we are back to displaying green in Church to remind us of our normal lives in a world where green is the colour of grass and leaves and healthy vegetables. In Gospel readings from Matthew we will think about things Jesus taught and did. His message was that the kingdom of God is at hand and you and I are invited to be members. My passport issued under the late Queen says,

'Her Britannic Majesty's Secretary of State requests and requires in the name of her Majesty all those whom it may concern to allow the bearer to pass freely without let and hindrance, and to afford the bearer such assistance and protection as may be necessary.'

That doesn't mean I will be safe and free to travel in every country. There are places on earth that are hostile and dangerous for British citizens. But it gives me confidence to know that Britain is looking out for me and the reputation of my country is at stake in how I behave.

Jesus invites us to travel through our lives as his messengers, bringing compassion and care to people who need it. We carry invisible passports saying we belong to his kingdom. We will meet pockets of hostility and rejection as he did but we need never be ashamed of our citizenship and the home where we belong is never in doubt.

Did you know that the Benefice holds regular prayer meetings? Everyone welcome.


