From the Vicarage:

Engage with the King



I wonder what you might be doing over the coronation weekend. Perhaps you are spending it with family and having an afternoon tea in front of the 'telly' watching the Ceremony together? Maybe you are joining in with the local community in parties, fancy dress, songs and parades? Or are you just glad of a couple of bank holidays to catch up on that overdue DIY and spend some time on a good walk to escape it all?

Royalist or not, we have all been given the invitation and the time to join in with this moment in history. It will happen whatever our thoughts are.

Writing a Coronation song for our schools recently, I realised that it was much harder to write for a King than for a Queen. Why is that? Maybe it's because I had great respect for the late Queen, was certain of her faith in Jesus Christ and grateful for her loyal service. Writing for a King is something I do regularly; but not for a human King ... for King Jesus, who we worship and adore. "O Worship the KING" "KING OF GLORY KING OF PEACE"

Writing a song for the coronation of King Charles was, therefore, a challenge. As much as I respect him and the Royal family, I don't have a personal affinity or relationship with him and certainly don't worship him; yet I'm happy to encourage our youngsters to mark this date in history with music that reflects the day and to help them engage with it and the recognition that it deserves. But then I reflect on what I feel and know about My God and My King. I want to worship HIM and sing to HIM because I have a relationship with HIM and Faith in HIM. HE is the King of Glory. He is the King eternal, the Everlasting King, the Prince of Peace. Nothing compares to Him, so let's not even try.

So; join in the party with our communities with gusto and friendship, making memories to carry forward for ourselves and for future generations. Come and celebrate with us at The Gathering Coronation service on Sunday May 7th in Askrigg to give thanks and pray for the new King of England. But let us remember that we *all* have an invitation to another party. A celebration in Heaven hosted by the KING OF KINGS.

You might choose to look the other way, refuse the invitation, spend your time on something else or consciously decide to not engage, but when you encounter *this* King, He is for life and for all the time that lies beyond this life and He wants us to know Him personally. He was human too but without blemish and came to bring *'life in all its fullness'* Jn10:10 Engage with this King. He loves you.



Welcome to our new Bishop: The Bishop of Ripon. The Revd. Canon Anna Eltringham

The Revd Canon Anna Eltringham, currently the Team Rector for Oxted, in the Diocese of Southwark, will be the new Bishop of Ripon, Downing Street announced – Thursday April 27th.

She will swap Surrey's North Downs for the Yorkshire Dales and more when she becomes an Episcopal Area Bishop in the Anglican Diocese of Leeds, serving many rural parishes and varied urban communities from Ripon to Ribblehead and Richmond to Wetherby.

"Being nominated to be the next Bishop of Ripon is an honour. I am excited to serve God and his people in this place and prayerfully grow his Kingdom on earth together," Anna said.

Looking forward to her new role, Anna said: "God has laid a number of things on my heart in recent times, including a passion for climate-care and justice; care for the wellbeing of clergy and all God's people; a vision for a church that serves as much beyond as within its buildings; and children and young people at the heart of it all."

Saxophone-playing Anna is married to Nigel and they have two daughters. They enjoy family trips out in her VW T25 campervan and visiting museums, galleries, arts events and the seaside. She also likes creative writing, walks in the country, trying to up-cycle furniture and chatting over a glass of something chilled.


