## From the Vicarage:

## Operating from a place of Rest

I love the different ways in which the Lord gets our attention.

I'm sure you have experienced moments in your life when a particular message, phrase or word keeps crossing your path. Recently, Sarah and I have both been experiencing this with certain scriptures being brought to our attention in different ways. People we have met, books we are reading, Bible podcasts we are listening to have all been drawing our attention to the Godly principle of holding things gently and working from a place of rest.

Now; those of you who know me a little better will have noticed that I can easily find things to keep me occupied and so this essential state of grace can, at times, seem rather elusive even when I know I need it. There is the challenge. We know what is good for us but 'life' and all its activity can so easily become greater than it should be and we can find ourselves losing out on the everyday joy of living. That's why it's so important to keep regular appointments with the Lord to 'breathe in' & receive from him, enabling us to walk more closely and in harmony with Him.

John Ortberg in his book 'Soul Keeping' points out that the world teaches us to be more concerned about the condition of our cars and careers than our souls. Perhaps because a dented soul is easier to keep hidden than a dented car, but if our souls become unhealthy then it's certainly bad news for us but it can be even worse news for everyone else around us! Spending time with the Lord is essential. As Disciples of Christ we are light carriers and the world is in desperate need for this light so we must do all we can to preserve it and allow it to shine brightly. This, as I have been reminded of on numerous occasions recently, works best when my 'inner tempo' is slower and my soul is operating from a place of godly rest. Then, 'things' just seem to happen and I'm in a better place to respond to them like the wonderful time spent chatting with a young farmer on a quiet roadside early one morning resulting in a time of prayer together, or the timely unplanned meeting and prayer with two special people in St Margaret's one evening or the 'coincidental' encounter with a grieving husband allowing time to listen to his heart and to share God's love for him.

As the dale begins to receive its summer visitors seeking rest and refreshing, many of you will be busier than ever as you facilitate their recreation or respond to the never ending demands of the land and its livestock. I encourage you, all the more, to join with me in a desire to do things differently this month. Start the day with a quiet time of prayerful preparation, take a few moments out with the Lord when the pressure is building and learn Christ's 'unforced rhythms of grace'


