From the Vicarage:

Why bother with Lent?

Lent is meant to be a time of reflection. A period of prayerful contemplation on the events that lead Jesus to the cross and the triumph of Easter Day. From my perspective, despite my very best intentions, it seems to be rushing away from me again and I am having to fight hard to take control of the diary.

We will all have our preferred time of the day to sit with the Lord, to listen and to pray. My favoured time is early morning before the events of the day start to take hold. I am appreciating joining with the group from across the Benefice in following the Nicky Gumbel commentary on reading the Bible in a year. It's been so good to join with others in discussing our progress. I commend it to you.

So; before we reach the meditations of Holy Week and the celebrations of Easter, let's apply the brakes and consider what Lent is all about before it's been and gone. Fundamentally, it's about preparation. Preparation for Easter, preparation for Life and preparation for life beyond this life.

Without a mindful Lent and particularly the contemplative walk of Holy Week, it can feel like we stumble upon Easter almost accidentally and as a consequence we can lose out on its significance and awesome power in our lives. Whatever we do, or don't do, the purpose is to keep our attention on Christ, His voice and His will.

Lent doesn't last. Easter is coming. The struggles of life will, through faith in Jesus Christ, give way to a glorious victory and eternity spent with Him. The long Lent of life will take us into an eternal Easter! As a Church, nationally and locally, we would do well to consider the issue of eternity far more than we presently do. Just a few reasons as to why we should bother with Lent. There are lots of different opportunities to draw close to the Lord together in the coming month.

Maundy Thursday – 28th March

Maundy Benefice Supper at St Oswald's Church, Askrigg starting at **6.15pm** prompt. Please sign up in church or let the office know for catering purposes (vegetarian option available). Reflective Holy Communion follows at **7.15pm**



Good Friday – 29th March

Churches Together **Walk of Witness** from Gayle Chapel to Hawes starts at **10.30am** During the walk we will reflect on events of that first Easter nearly 2000 years ago, as we walk through the town to take part in a Good Friday service at **11.30 am** at **St Margaret's Church**

Good Friday Walk from the beach at Semerwater, leaving at 2pm and walking to St Matthew's Church Stalling Busk for Hot Cross Buns (approx. 3pm). The walk will pause for a short prayer at the cross in the old churchyard. The full walk (there and back) is about 3 miles, but there may be lifts back available



Easter Sunday – 31st March

Begin the day in the beautiful and serene surroundings of Semerwater with the family **Daybreak Service** starting this year at **6.30am.** Watch the sunrise over Addlebrough and enjoy bread and fish on the shores of the lake, together with a short service led by Rev Dave. Later in the day, there will be a **Communion Service** in **Hardraw at 9am** and in **Hawes at 10.30am**, both led by Rev Dave. Rev Vera Sinton will lead the communion service at **Askrigg at 10.30am**


