From the Vicarage



'Seek peace and pursue it' Ps.34:14 So wrote King David some 3000 years ago. Writing from personal experience he knew that violence and aggression leads to fear and misery for everyone involved and will, ultimately, require some form of a resolution agreed around a table. Sadly, several millennia later, the distress and destruction of war continues to reap havoc within the Middle East and between so many other nations around the world.

November remains a month where our nation, along with so many others around the world, will pause to remember the countless number of lives lost through conflict and in acts of service. Since I was a child I have always found Remembrance Sunday a moving and a special occasion; not in any jingoistic or xenophobic way, but in a manner of respect and gratitude for the sacrifice of those who have gone before us. I lived with first-hand accounts from my family of what that meant, what that looked like and what that cost. My great Uncle was posted to the Far East to fight. Having failed to receive a single letter in almost 4 years his family thought him, like so many others, had been lost in action and the whereabouts of his body, unknown. His unannounced return created shock and joy but to his dying day, he never spoke a word of what he had experienced.

Last month I repaid a visit to the Yorkshire Air Museum at Elvington and was struck once again by the size and the fragility of the Halifax Bomber, 'Friday the 13th' that is housed in a hangar there. The Halifax flew in great numbers from Elvington and from other airfields from across East Yorkshire. My admiration was rekindled as I considered once more the courage and self-sacrifice of my grandparent's generation and thanked God that I had never had to face such a similar challenge. And yet we know, all too sadly, that violence and injustice continue to ravage our world. It was never meant to be like this.

2,000 years after King David, the prophet Isaiah spoke the heart of God when he gave the instruction: 'stop doing evil and learn to do what is right. See that justice is done; help those who are oppressed, give orphans their rights, and defend the defenceless' Isaiah1:16f

In a world where we continue to create and deliver such havoc and horror upon one another, may we be willing to consider our part in it all, repent and remember Christ's sacrifice for us.

On the 9th of November I shall be leading a service of Remembrance in St Margaret's, and at the War Memorial at Town Head in Hawes. Once again, I shall be inviting those gathered there to join me in the following prayer. 'Almighty God; this day I pray for peace. That the world may live for peace, the frightened and the lonely would know your peace, that people and rulers would seek for peace and that it might begin with me.' Year on year, the urgency behind this prayer appears to increase.


A number of people have asked about different ways of giving to the church following Dave's talks on God's generosity, which have prompted people to think about how much, and the way in which, they give to the church.

Regular planned giving is important for the church to be able to budget. The Parish Giving Scheme is the preferred method for most church treasurers. The Parish Giving Scheme (PGS) is a national Anglican charity which facilitates regular, planned giving on behalf of our churches and also claims the Gift Aid where appropriate. It is not for profit organisation and the money that is collected is forwarded to our treasurers in one lump sum, including the gift aid, cutting the work that they have to do. Leaflets are available about the PGS in our churches, but if you want to find out more you can find details on their website:

It is also possible to give one off donations via the PGS too. Hawes and Askrigg both have had this system up and running for some years. If you wish to set up a regular donation or make a one-off payment you can do this via the website above, or by using the QR codes below which will take you directly to the PGS for the appropriate church.

- by setting up a standing order or direct debit through your bank please contact the treasurer of the church or the Office to get the correct bank account details.
- In cash. Some people still prefer to make their donations in cash, and a collection plate is available in church. Outside of service times, each church also has a place for donations.
 However most churches now have to pay to deposit cash and this does reduce the donation.

If you would like to make a donation to St Matthew's at Stalling Busk or St Mary & St John's in Hardraw, at the current time they are in the process of setting up their accounts with the PGS. You can still give one off amounts via the QR codes below.
