It was an emotional occasion filled with music and prayer, a message from Bishop Nick and tributes to his lengthy time of ministry across the nation and overseas from a wide range of speakers including the Archbishop of York and the Archbishop of Sudan.

As we look to our celebration of the human birth of our Heavenly King, our world and our nation often seems as fractured and as broken as it was 2000 years ago but Bishop Nick reminded us of the glorious hope we have in Christ Jesus.

Let's allow the Christ child in the manger to wrap His love around our hearts this Christmas. From Sarah and myself: May you know the joy of Christ this Christmas!








SUNFLOWERS

Advent Wreaths

Around the Benefice your wardens and members of the church family have been getting ready for the start of Advent by creating Advent Wreaths for our four buildings.

The Advent wreath first appeared in Germany in 1839. A Lutheran minister working at a mission for children created a wreath out of the wheel of a cart. He placed twenty small red candles and four large white candles inside the ring. The red candles were lit on weekdays and the four white candles were lit on Sundays.

Eventually, the Advent wreath was created out of evergreens, symbolizing everlasting life in the midst of winter and death. The circle reminds us of God's unending love and the eternal life He makes possible. Advent candles are often nestled in the evergreen wreath. Additional decorations, like holly and berries, are sometimes added. Their red colour points ahead to Jesus' sacrifice and death. Pinecones can symbolize the new life that Jesus brings through His resurrection.

The most common Advent wreath tradition involves four candles. A new candle is lit on each of the four Sundays before Christmas. Different colours are often used to represent the principal themes of hope, faith, joy, peace and love or they may be used to remind us of important characters in the advent journey – the patriarchs, the prophets and John the Baptist are frequently represented with purple or red candles. Mary the mother of Jesus with a pink candle and for the arrival of Jesus on Christmas Day a white candle is used.

Our Sunday worship will begin with a prayer reminding us of the theme or person for that particular day.



For many Christians unfamiliar with the liturgical year, there may be some confusion surrounding the meaning of the Advent season. Some people may know that the Advent season focuses on expectation and think that it serves as an anticipation of Christ's birth in the season leading up to Christmas. This is part of the story, but there's much more to Advent than that.

Advent is a time of looking forward and a time of looking back. Looking back to the beginning of God's narrative of redemption for the world and *forward* to His return in glory. The Patriarchs heard God's call and followed. The Prophet's shared their dreams and visions that others might follow. The history of the chosen people is full of stark contrasts – triumph and disaster, freedom and slavery, homeland and exile.

The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word adventus, meaning "Arrival."

It is believed that during the 4th and 5th centuries Advent was a season of preparation for the baptism of new Christians at the January feast of Epiphany. During this season of preparation, Christians would spend 40 days in penance, prayer, and fasting to prepare for this celebration. Originally, there was little connection between Advent and Christmas.

By the 6th century, however, Roman Christians had tied Advent to the coming of Christ. The "arrival" they had in mind however, was not Christ's first coming in the manger in Bethlehem, but rather his *second* as the judge of the world. It was not until the Middle Ages that the Advent season was explicitly linked to Christ's first coming at Christmas.

Advent also creates an opportunity for us to pause and reflect on the BIG issues of life: the 'four last things': death, judgement, Heaven, hell.

Today, the season of Advent lasts for four Sundays leading up to Christmas. It's a season of expectation and preparation. A time of looking *back* on the promises of God that were fulfilled in the birth of Jesus Christ but also in looking *forward* to the promises that are yet to come and of His return in glory. It's so easy for us to become lost in the busyness of the preparation for Christmas Day that we can forget these things and lose sight of the joy that there is in walking closely with the Lord along the way.

You have often heard me extend the invitation to 'Have a Coffee with the Lord', so this Advent, why not plan in some essential down time to do precisely that?

Put on some music, light a candle and spend some time with the one who loves you and longs to spend some quality time with you.

Prayer: Come Holy Spirit as we journey together this Advent. May our longing for Christ find fresh fulfilment, our waiting on Christ reveal new insight and our faith in Christ generate new strength and Hope in God's story of Salvation.
